About AGC

Mission

“All God’s Children provides care and support to young mothers and their children and families. Through Christ-centered ministries, our non-profit organization offers safe, temporary shelter and programs which address their physical, emotional, education and spiritual needs. By offering sufficient support and life skills, we believe that young women can move beyond challenging circumstances to become loving parents and productive citizens.”



Purposes

- To offer a service which responds to the issue of teenage pregnancy in a more organized fashion than the limited efforts of private citizens
- To provide an alternative to abortion, and
- To provide sufficient tools so that teenage mothers can create a healthy physical and spiritual life for themselves and their children



Guiding Principles

- ♦ Children have the right to be nurtured in a safe environment.
- ♦ Given the right support and life skills, we believe young mothers can succeed.
- ♦ Under grace, living up to and following our Statement of Faith.



Statement of Faith

We believe:

...the Bible to be the infallible Word of God, that it is His Holy and inspired Word, and that it is of supreme and final authority.

...in one God, eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

...Jesus Christ was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary. He led a sinless life, took all of our sins on Himself, died and rose again, and is seated at the right hand of the Father as our mediator and advocate.

...that all mankind everywhere are lost and face the judgment of God, and need to come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ alone, through His shed blood on the cross, and by grace through faith alone.

...that Christ rose from the dead and is coming soon.

...there exists a literal heaven as an eternal destiny for those in personal relationship with Jesus Christ, and a literal hell for those who die without Christ.

...in holy Christian living, and that we must have concern for the hurts and social needs of our fellow humankind.

Executive Address



Thank you for taking the time to review our Annual Report. This document shows you our vital financial and service/programming numbers for the past year.

Having just completed our 10th anniversary of service to hurting moms and babies, it was time for a period of reflection to ensure we're still on the track that God inspired us to take in the late 1990's.

Understandably, I could start my review with financial reports, or outcome measurements or other facts/figures and perform some detailed analysis. Not this time. Instead, I went to the stack of unsolicited notes and letters of past residents who took the time to share their thoughts on what they took from their experience at AGC. Some of their comments are shown later in this document, but there is not enough space to print them all or even the better ones. But, they are available for viewing anytime you would like to visit us at AGC. We love to reminisce about our former moms and babies.

The one reoccurring theme in almost all notes and letters was the repeated mention of the "love" shown to them and their baby during their stay at AGC. Then I quickly recalled how so many of our residents come to us without being shown the "appropriate" love that **Christ** taught us to display. So for many of these young ladies, AGC was their first opportunity to see the unconditional love of **Christ**. At first, that unconditional love caught many by surprise, many didn't recognize it, and many just didn't know how to receive it without something being required in return. But it's clear **God** instilled in all of us the need to be loved, and eventually, most of these young ladies learned that AGC and its staff loved them with a special love they had not previously encountered.

You show love by what you do, not just by what you feel. A pre-requisite for being a staff member at AGC is a commitment to show love to these moms and babies despite how your day may be unraveling, and despite the fact that some of our residents are sometimes difficult to love. But love is a choice AND a commitment. You choose to love or you choose not to love.

From everything I have read from former residents over these past 10 years, I believe **God** would be pleased with how the AGC staff is allowing love to overflow our lives and into the lives of those we serve

- There are three primary programs within AGC:**
- Mother/Baby Home (residential living)
 - Independent Living apartments
 - Daycare for the children of residents

All God's Children (AGC) is a residential treatment facility for pregnant and parenting teenage girls, nestled in the heart of Jessamine County, Kentucky.

Services are offered to meet needs in all areas of the lives of the troubled teens we serve: Therapeutic treatment, Educational services, Parenting, Substance abuse education to prevent relapse for those who have been addicted, and developing the Life Skills necessary to become a successful, contributing member of our society.

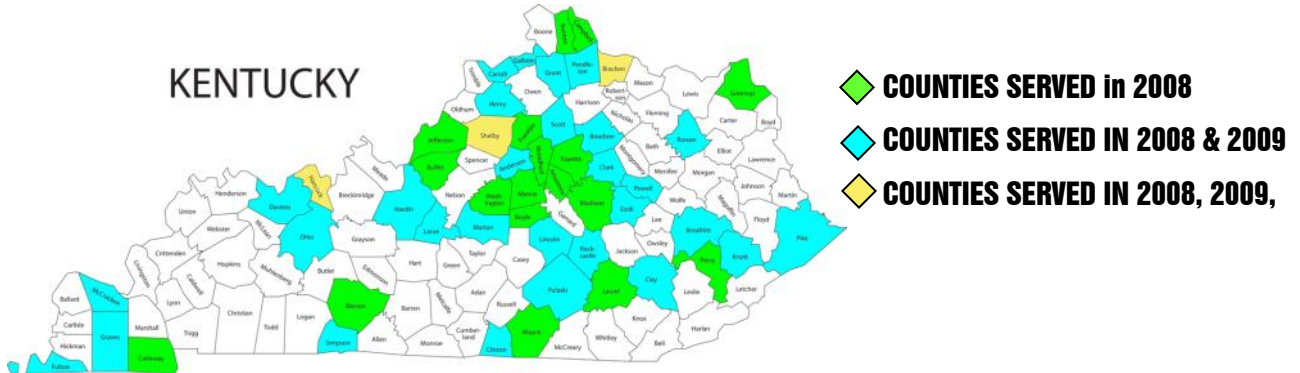


Fun Facts

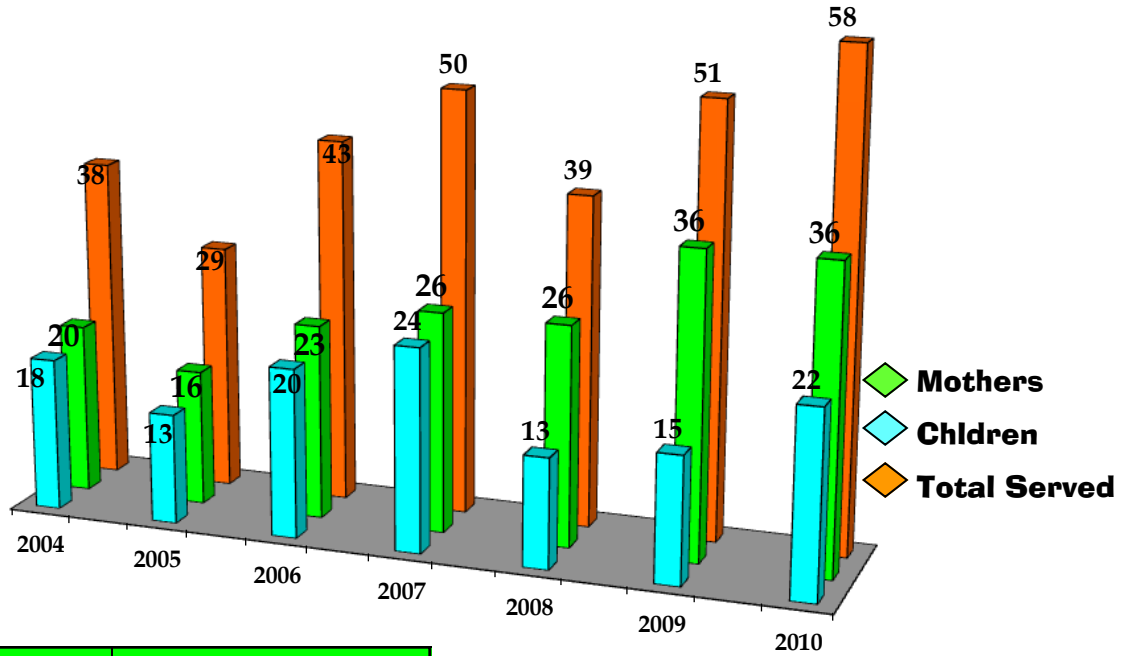
- ◆ AGC served 58 moms and children in 2010
- ◆ On average, moms & babies stayed at AGC for 96 days
- ◆ 91% of our residents were able to move to a less restrictive placement when they left our program.
- ◆ Following up on our girls served this year, we find that 72% have obtained their diploma or GED or are still working on it.

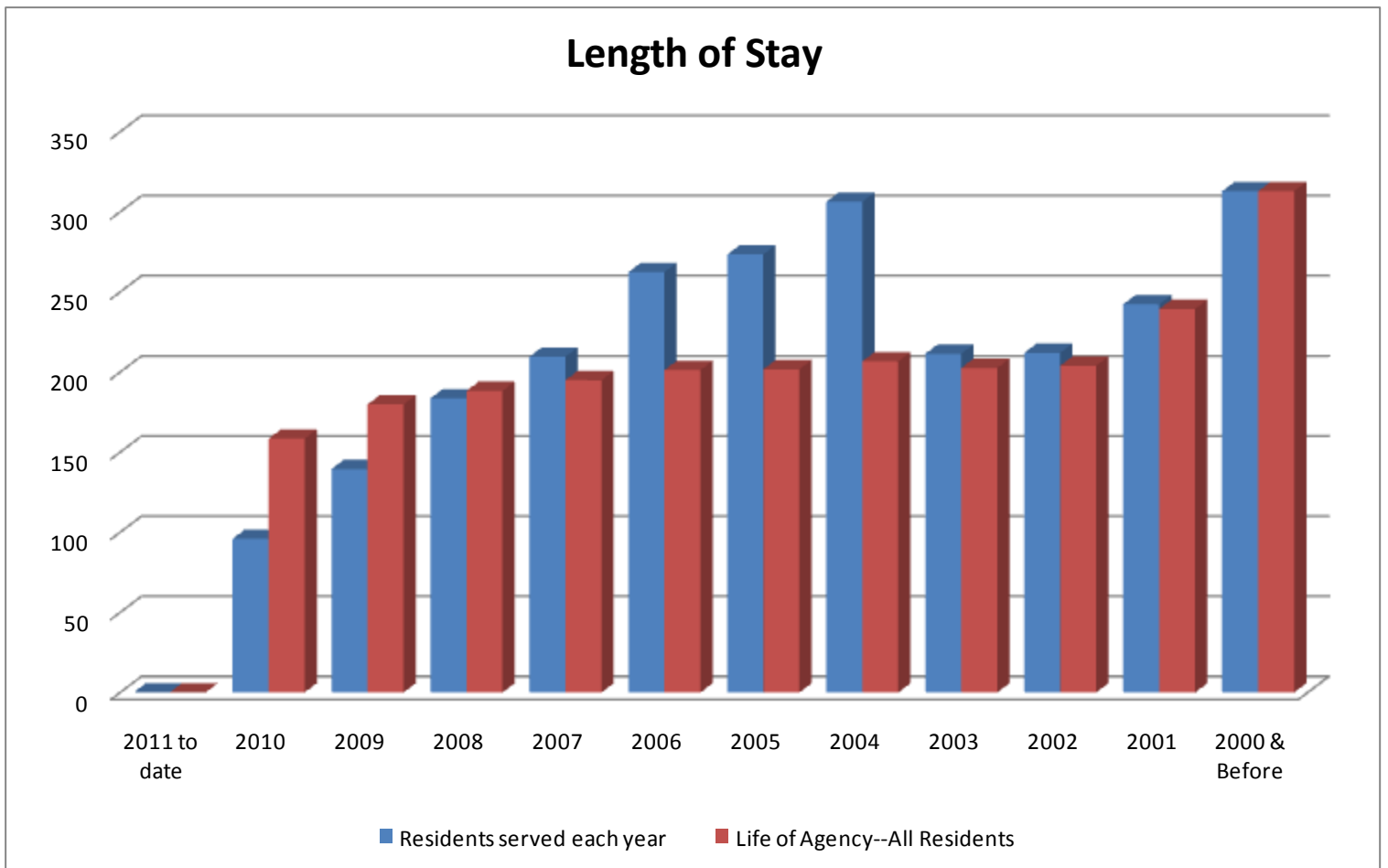

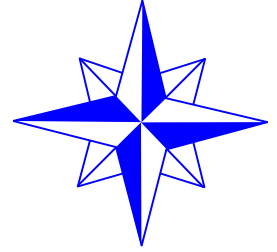

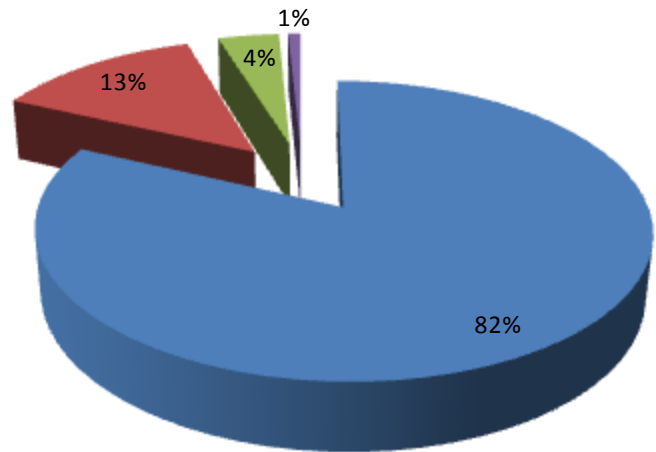
HOW LONG DO OUR GIRLS STAY?



Funding Sources



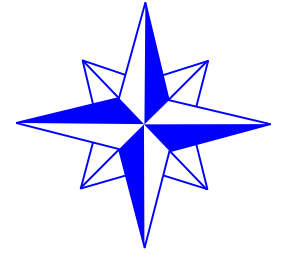
■ Program reimbursements

 ■ Investment Income



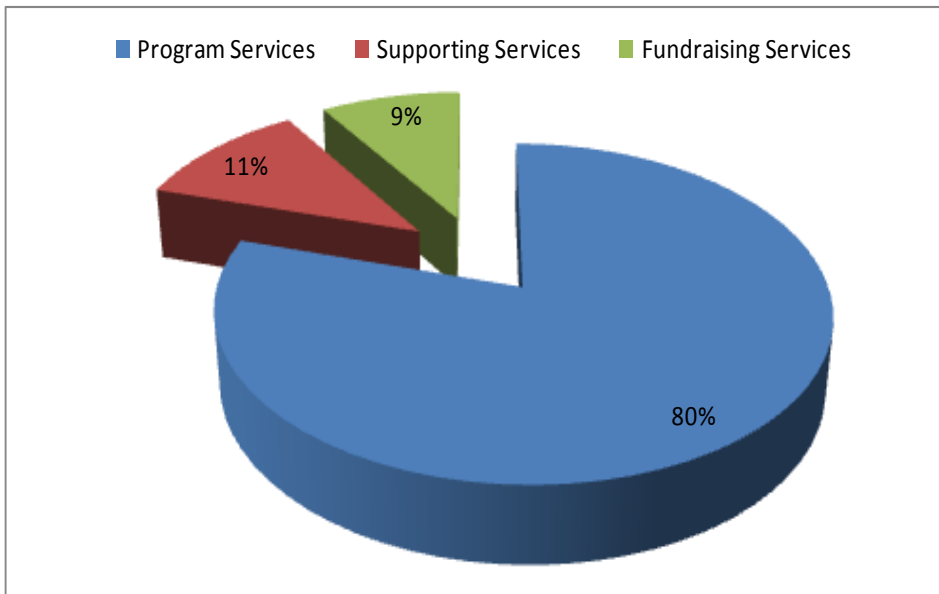
